HOW TO REMOVE YOUR FABRIC AWNING IN THE EVENT OF A HURRICANE

HOW TO REMOVE YOUR FABRIC AWNING

Your Fabric Awning or Canopy consists of a frame structure and a fabric cover. The cover is secured by rope at the perimeter and on the rafters (if applicable).


The fabric connection at the top is either slid into an aluminum rail or laced to a pipe.

STEP ONE

Cut the lacing rope. This should be done below the grommets (Brass Eyelets).

DO NOT SAVE THE ROPE!

**BE CAREFUL NOT TO CUT
THE AWNING FABRIC**



STEP TWO


Many Awnings have a waterproof aluminum canvas rail located on the wall at the top of the awning or canopy. The fabric slides into this rail. Roll the fabric **UP** toward the rail.

STEP THREE

These are the ways to secure your awning.


OPTION A

(If you have aluminum rail, at the top)
The fabric can be removed by sliding the canvas fabric out of the rail. The fabric can then be neatly rolled up or folded. Please store the fabric inside. Use a screwdriver to open the rail on the end and slide fabric toward you.



OPTION B

(If you have a pipe only, at the top)
Roll the fabric up toward the top and secure it intermittently with the backs or rope, lashing it to the framework.
